RULE 9- Section 4: Lease Agreement.

A. All lease agreements must be correctly completed on an official Register Lease Agreement form and filed with the Registrar with the following:

1. Registration name and number of the horse being leased.
2. Names and addresses of lessor(s) and lessee(s) clear typed or printed.
3. Beginning and termination dates of the lease. If termination date is "until further notice," so state.
4. All markings, coat colour and other marks of identity of the horse being leased.
5. The personal signatures of the lessor(s) and lessee(s).

B. The applicable fee must accompany the lease form.

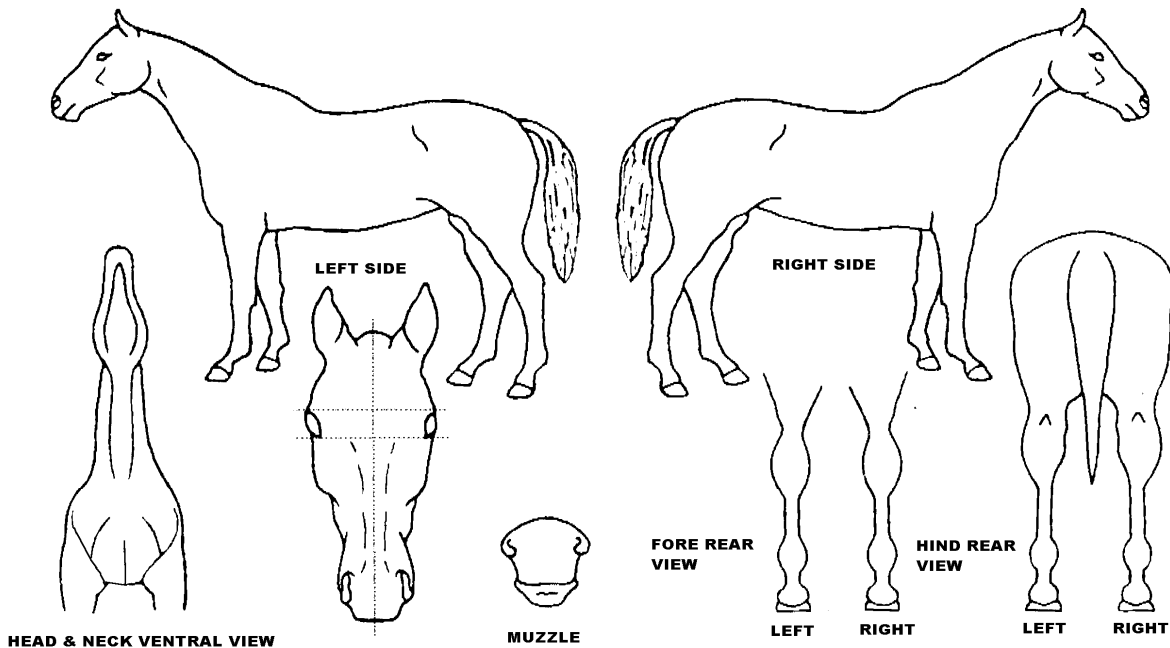

Star - A white mark on the forehead, located above a line running from

eye. to eye

Strip - A white marking extending from the line of the eyes toward the line running from nostril to nostril.

Snip - A white or flesh mark between the nostrils or on the upper or lower lip.

Heel - A white marking found on the back of the foot.

Coronet - A white marking extending to approximately 1" above the hoof.

Pastern - A white marking extending to the top of the pastern.

Fetlock - A white marking extending to the top of the fetlock

Sock - A white marking extending to midway on the cannon.

Stocking - A white mark extending above midway on the cannon.

Spats - Pigmented spots located within white.
